WORSHIP SCHEDULE

The worship committee received 48 responses from our recent survey! Thank you for participating! The first question about worship times received these responses:

- 20 votes for I would like to leave the current blended serve at 11:00 a.m.
- 16 votes for I would like to move the current service to 10:00 a.m.
- 8 votes for I would prefer we have 2 services: 1 at 8:30 and 1 at 11:00 a.m.
- 4 surveys did not answer this question.

Since the two service option received only 8 votes, and the votes were so close between the other options, the worship committee went to those 8 people and asked them to choose between the 10 or 11 start time. (During this time, we also received 2 late surveys) With those additions, the survey showed:

- 26 votes for 11:00 a.m.
- 20 votes for 10:00 a.m.

Since the results were 55% for 11 and 45% at 10, our church council leadership decided to split the difference. Our blended worship service will begin at 10:30 a.m. on our annual meeting date, November 13th. Until then, our worship will continue at 11:00 a.m.

After the first of the year, Gathering Space will return at 9:00 a.m. Our survey showed a strong interest in resuming this educational time together.

BENEVOLENCE GIFTS

At our August meeting, our church council voted to share \$2,000 to help those in Kentucky and surrounding states recover from the devastating flooding this summer. This money was shared with Lutheran Disaster Response. Here's how that money, along with other donations, will be used. "To respond to the flooding, Lutheran Disaster Response (LDR) is supporting the Indiana-Kentucky Synod to rebuild homes in Owsley County, one of the poorest counties in Kentucky. The homes all belong to families who wouldn't have been able to rebuild without financial support. Additionally, the synod is replacing septic tanks for 25 families. LDR is also supporting Lutheran Church of the Resurrection, which accompanies Manna from Heaven, a feeding ministry in Myra, KY, that received an ELCA World Hunger Domestic Hunger Grant. It lost everything inside the building and the LDR grant will replace the building's contents, including furniture and food storage appliances, as well as rewiring the electricity for the building." 
