In the past few weeks, the Bible 101 group has been tackling the book of Revelation. We're toward the end of the book right now, looking at the beautiful passages in chapters 20 and 21.

Together we've been thinking about how this book speaks to those, like the early Christians, who are being oppressed by a political power (for the early church this was Rome). The book assures them and us that ultimately, God will triumph over the forces of tyranny and evil. Interestingly enough, God's triumph is so ultimate that no battles are actually fought in the book—armies line up to fight, but God declares victory and is unchallenged.

An interesting aspect of the book is how the imagery of Revelation shows up in our worship service. During Easter we're singing, "This is the feast, the victory of our God, for the lamb who was slain has begun his reign. Worthy is Christ, the lamb who was slain, whose blood set us free to be people of God. Power, riches, wisdom and strength, and honor, blessing and glory are his".

In the book of Revelation, it is the slain lamb that appears several times, but especially in the 21st chapter. John describes the heavenly city as not needing the sun or moon to provide light, because the Lamb is its light (Rev. 22:23). I'm reminded of Jesus saying, "I am the light of the world", in John's gospel (John 8:12).

As we walk through this Easter season together, as we luxuriate in the signs of spring all around us, let us celebrate Jesus' death and resurrection. God has conquered and will continue to work in our world for peace, for justice, for love. We are called to be treasured partners in this work. Our future is wrapped up in God's plan to redeem the world.

# **OUTREACH QUARTERLY GIFTS**

Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Services has been gifted with our outreach funds for the first two quarters of this year. LIRS is working intensely in easter Europe to help with Ukrainians who are fleeing their country. ### **FURNACE REPLACEMENT**

Did you know our church has 7 furnaces? The property team has been monitoring these closely over the years. Each year we have our roofing contractor come and service these. Some of these have already been replaced over time. This May we will be replacing a unit that was installed back in the 2002 expansion. We want to thank Joe Kahl for taking the lead to get us 3 installation quotes to ensure we were good stewards of our financials vs our needs. The decision was made at council to select Overcashier & Horst who came with the lowest yet comparable in service to the others. Cost will be \$8350 vs the other bids of \$9365 and \$14946. Installation will be in early May. Our current Capital Improvement (formerly Building) Fund is \$18,344. We will be using funds from this account to pay for this need which brings us down to \$10,000 left. We wanted to share this info as we will need to look at building this fund back up for future Capital needs. Please consider giving to the Capital Improvement Fund whenever an opportunity arises. # **HEARING ASSISTANCE AVAILABLE**


