17, Meditation

Did you read these words in a High School English class? For many, it's where we first encounter these phrases from John Donne, written in 1623. I remember reading them and being struck by the idea that we are all united, all connected.

What I didn't realize, and this may be new to you as well, that John Donne was in the midst of the plague epidemic when he wrote this. In fact, he was sick in bed, afraid for a few days that he, too, was going to die. As he lay in bed, he could hear the church bells in London, tolling to note the death of each person. At times, they would hardly stop. When I learned that, I found these words even more interesting.

For a whole year now, we have ourselves been in the midst of an epidemic. And in that time, we have been encouraged to think of others as well as ourselves, to wear masks, keep distance, avoid large gatherings, etc. We have been doing this to protect ourselves, but also to protect those around us. I remember at first thinking the Facebook post was kind of cute---"To save the world, your grandparents went to war. To save the world now, all you have to do is sit on your couch and watch movies". But after a year of this behavior, it is proving to be harder than I first thought.

I know that we are all yearning and longing for life to return to "normal". And with the vaccines and people getting their shots, the end is in sight.

Until then, though, I would encourage us to use these days of Lent to buckle down and make sure that we're continuing to be safe and that we're continuing to keep others safe by our own behavior.

I would also encourage us to reach out to others because we need each other. We are all together a part of the whole. We are all connected, part of the body of Christ.

The last year has been full of changes and challenges for all of us. Now we are again witnessing a devastating disaster amid the ongoing pandemic. As neighbors in Christ, we have an opportunity to share God's hope, healing and renewal with each other.

Beginning Feb. 14, a polar vortex descended over the United States. Subfreezing temperatures and heavy snow swept across the country, impacting millions of people. The harsh conditions severely impacted Southern states, such as Texas, which lack the infrastructure to handle the freezing temperatures and record-setting snow and ice. This has led to power, food and water shortages throughout the region. At its peak, 4.5 million homes and businesses in Texas were without power. With bursting pipes and broken water systems, around 10 million Texans are facing water disruptions. As temperatures rise, melting ice and snow is expected to cause more water damage.

Lutheran Disaster Response is collaborating with the Texas-Louisiana Gulf Coast Synod, the Southwestern Texas Synod, the Northern Texas-Northern Louisiana Synod, and Lutheran Social Services Disaster Response. Congregations are already conducting relief efforts such as supplying water, food and generators to those in need and opening their doors to serve as shelters. Long-term recovery may include repairing water-damaged homes, disaster case management and supporting vulnerable populations.




