Ah, the start of a new school year—the stores have displays of crayons, markers, pencils and pens. The colors of markers and the sheen of 3 ring binders fill those pop-up displays.

For me, the start of the school year was an exciting and somewhat anxious time—who would be my homeroom teacher? Who would be in my class? The school year stretched out before me.... some parts the same (yes, I would likely hate gym class and love English) and yet some things could be different.

I'm not sure who began this tradition we have of covenanting. Whoever first had the idea—connecting it to this time of back to school way inspired.

In much the same way, this re-covenanting gives us the opportunity to make a fresh start. To think about different ways we might want to relate to our faith and to this community. To commit to doing something new for us. To stay with the activities we love. To be reminded that living out our faith in the world is conscious choice.

As we think about this covenant, we're invited to think about the promises we made in baptism or when we were confirmed (when we affirmed our baptism). These promises are printed on the covenant itself, but they're worth seeing here, too.

You have made public profession of your faith. Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in holy baptism:

to live among God's faithful people, proclaim the word of God and share in the Lord's supper, to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed, to serve all people, following the example of Jesus, and work for justice and peace in all the earth?

I do, and I ask God to help and guide me.

These promises are so big, so overwhelming, that we can't begin to accomplish them on our own, and yet—we cannot ignore them or pretend it's someone else's job to be working on them. No matter what or when or where we find ourselves, we have always needed people from a variety of backgrounds to speak a word of love, of peace, of hope, and of healing to our world. And as Christians, this calling is our reason for being. Even as others share this work, we bring something unique in that we speak these needed words out of the context of Jesus's life-giving act on the cross.

So, you're invited to think about these things, about God's calling, and to prayerfully consider your response to God's invitation and bring your signed covenant forward during our worship together, placing it on the altar. If you'd prefer, you can also mail or email your covenant back to St. Stephen as well. I give thanks that, together, we're on the start of this new year in faith.

From this warehouse, they're sent to people in crises around the world and here in the US as well. Last year, people like us provided 370,818 quilts and 140,117 school kits!! And we've been about this work for 80 years! That's a lot of love reaching our neighbors across the world!

One of our church council goals for 2025 is to partner with other churches in the area to share resources and strengthen bonds. LWR School Kits

Thanks to your generosity we have all the supplies we need to assemble 50 school kits! You're invited to help with putting the items in each cloth drawstring backpack. We'll be doing this as part of our "Almost end of summer" picnic and invite a friend Sunday on September 14th! Again, thanks to your generosity, we have gathered enough money to pay the costs of shipping both these school kits and our quilts to their final destinations! (The cost to send each quilt is \$2.80; the cost for a school kit is \$2.85)

PROJECT PIKIPIKI

Did you know that the Lutheran church in Tanzania is growing by leaps and bounds? Part of the growth in the church stems from the work of lay evangelists, who walk from village to village, typically 12-20 miles apart, to preach and provide pastoral care to these emerging communities of faith.

We've been a synod companion with the Dodoma Diocese in this African nation for many years. During this time, we've helped with various projects. They suggested and we agreed to see if we could help by providing motorbikes, to save hours of walking and help these evangelists be more effective in their ministries! Enter Project Pikipiki! Each pikipiki (pick-key/ pick-key) costs \$1,600 (including motorbike and regular maintenance). Currently, the Global Mission Board will match donations dollar for dollar for this project! Look for a video about this project to be shared in worship on September 7th. We'll collect donations for this project on September 14th and September 21st! We're hoping to reach the goal of \$1,600 which, with the matching money, would provide 2 pikipiki's!

Bishop's Report

ELCA Church Wide Assembly (July 27-August 2, 2025) report from Bishop Daniel Beaudoin

Our days in Phoenix, AZ were marked by inspiring worship, experiential learning, faithful deliberation, great food, and the 112 degree heat of Phoenix. But it's a "dry heat" they say.

I was delighted by the election of Bishop Yehiel Curry from the Metro Chicago Synod to serve as our next Presiding Bishop. I have served with Bishop Curry for the past 6 years and find him to be a humble, kind and mission-minded leader with a gift for articulating vision for our Church. His time as a mission developer, pastor, and synod bishop, is a gift to our church. I look forward to attending Bishop Curry's installation as the fifth Presiding Bishop of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America on October 4, at Central Lutheran Church in Minneapolis, Minnesota.



At the assembly we also elected and installed Pastor Lucille Mills as the new Secretary of the ELCA, overwhelmingly approved a new social statement (Faith and Civic Life), approved the Lutheran-Orthodox Common Statement on the Filoque, and adopted a number of important memorials that were sent to the Churchwide Assembly from Synod Assemblies.


