Maybe a snippet of song, or a certain smell, a particular plant, or even a color reminds you of "home". Maybe you feel home in that place between sleeping and waking. Or maybe you find yourself still waiting to find that "home".

Maybe what we sometimes fail to realize (and I succumb to this too) is that the feeling of "home" is not necessarily a place.

St. Augustine writes, "Our hearts are restless until they find their rest in Thee".

Perhaps this "home" we're trying to create has already been made for us—that home is resting on God's grace, cradled by God's love, knowing that we are forgiven and loved....to the ends of the earth and back...no matter what else happens. Nothing and no one can take this from us.

God creates "home" for us in Jesus—and in the birth of this tiny baby—invites us to come home, welcoming this baby Savior into the world, and working to make everywhere in this world feel like "home" for all of us, God's beloved children.

May this sense of God's love surround you during this Advent and Christmas season.






Euchre/Puzzle Night


